Meeting the Listing Criteria

Where possible, all requested information is to be provided. Additional information may be attached for consideration by the Scientific Advisory Committee.

To be recognised as 'threatened', a species must meet the criteria for listing. Please read the Guidelines for the listing of species under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* available from the Secretary of the Scientific Advisory Committee or from the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment web site (address above).

As the information contained in a nomination is central to the Committee's considerations, it is important that the information provided clearly follows the Guidelines and addresses the listing criteria contained in the Guidelines.

Public Availability and Confidentiality of Information Supplied

Information provided in your nomination may be made available to others outside the Scientific Advisory Committee. While the nominator's name is removed and information on any sensitive locations, all other information will generally be available for public consideration after the Committee has made its final recommendation.

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Nominators will have receipt of their nomination acknowledged prior to consideration and will be notified of a preliminary recommendation following consideration by the Scientific Advisory Committee.

The Committee undertakes to make its final recommendation on a nomination to the Minister within a 12 month period. During that time, the Committee will make a preliminary recommendation on a nomination and will place advertisements in Tasmanian newspapers seeking public comment on its recommendations. The Secretary will inform nominators in writing of the Committee's recommendations and public comment periods. 2. You are required to provide this information by the *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* and regulations made under this Act. Failure to provide this information may result in your application not being able to be processed or the service not being able to be provided.
3. Your personal information will be used for the primary purpose for which it is collected, and may be disclosed to contractors and agents of the Resource Management and Conservation Division, law enforcement agencies, courts and other organisations authorised to collect it.
4. Your basic personal information may be disclosed to other public sector bodies where necessary, for the efficient storage and use of the information.
5. Personal information will be managed in accordance with the *Personal Information Protection Act 2004* and may be accessed by the individual to whom it relates on request to DPIW. You may be charged a fee for this service.
