

# Walls of Jerusalem National Park

## Reservation History

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The Walls of Jerusalem National Park incorporates a number of former reserves. The history of each of these reserve areas is provided separately below. Each history has been compiled from a variety of sources and whilst all effort has been made there can be no assurance that it is a complete and accurate historical record for this reserve.

History last updated 12 August 2010

### Central Plateau Protected Area

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Date	Description
<b>12 September 1978</b>	The <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> (102,000 hectares) was established by Order No.157 of 1978 under the <i>Crown Lands Act 1976</i> .
<b>1 April 1981</b>	By virtue of Order 16 of 1981 under the <i>Crown Lands Act 1976</i> , 40,470 hectares (including 23,250 hectares indicated on LM Plan 181, 11,510 hectares indicated on LM Plan 182, and 5,710 hectares indicated on LM Plan 183) was revoked from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> . This Order removed 40,470 hectares from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> .
<b>1 March 1984</b>	By virtue of Order 8 of 1984 under the <i>Crown Lands Act 1976</i> , 2,953 hectares indicated on Plan 5985 was revoked from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> . This Order removed 2,953 hectares from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> .
<b>29 July 1992</b>	In accordance with Order No.22 of 1992 under the <i>Crown Lands Act 1976</i> , 18.63ha indicated on plan number LD 1376 was revoked from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> . This Order removed 18.63 hectares from the <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> .
<b>30 April 1999</b>	At the commencement of the relevant sections of the <i>Regional Forest Agreement (Land Classification) Act 1998</i> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> comprising 9,460 hectares (indicated on CPR Plan 4654) was revoked from reservation under the <i>Crown Lands Act 1976</i>, and;</li><li>• That same area of land was declared to be reserved land in the class of conservation area and given the name <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> being an extension to that reserve.</li></ul>

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### Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary

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Date	Description
<b>13 December 1978</b>	An area of Crown land comprising 40,000 hectares (indicated on L.M. Plan 124; was declared to be a conservation area to be known as the ' <b>Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary</b> ' under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 315 of 1978).
<b>24 June 1981</b>	As result of Statutory Rules 1981, No.128 under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> , 5,710ha of crown land in the vicinity of Chalice Lake indicated on LM Plan 183, that was previously part of the <b>Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary</b> was declared to be a State reserve and given the name <b>Cradle Mountain – Lake St Clair National Park</b> , being an extension to that reserve.

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## Central Plateau Conservation Area

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Date	Description
17 February 1982	All Crown land within the 23,250 hectare area indicated on LM Plan 181 was declared to be a conservation area,(including the remainder of the <b>Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary</b> ) and given the name ' <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> ', under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 1982, No.13). The reserve known as <b>Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary</b> ceased to exist and was incorporated into the new <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> .
27 June 1990	Crown land totalling 89,200 hectares (indicated on CPR Plans 1884, 1889, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1896, 1897, 1898, 1906, 1907, 1908, 1909, 1916, 1917 and 1918; shown indicatively and in smaller scale on CPR Plan *1827; and including land formally part of the ' <b>Central Plateau Protected Area</b> ') was declared to be a conservation area, to be known as the ' <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> ', under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 1990, No.79).
30 April 1999	At the commencement of the relevant sections of the <i>Regional Forest Agreement (Land Classification) Act 1998</i> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the conservation area known as the '<b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b>' was revoked by virtue of section 12 of that Act, and by virtue of section 17 (2) of that Act the same area was declared to be reserved land in the class of conservation area and was taken to have been so declared under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> and continued to be known by the same name - '<b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b>', and;</li><li>• by virtue of section 17(4) of that Act; 9,460 hectares of Crown land (indicated on CPR Plan 4654) was declared to be reserved land in the class of conservation area and given the name '<b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b>', being an extension to the existing reserve.</li></ul>
27 December 2000	Two areas of Crown land comprising 3,915 hectares (including 2,730 hectares indicated on CPR Plan 5006 and 1,185 hectares indicated on CPR Plan 4609) were declared to be conservation areas and were given the name ' <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> ', under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 2000, No.241) being an extension to the existing reserve.
26 December 2001	In a proclamation under sections 14(1) and 16(1) of the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 2001, No. 180) the boundaries of the reserve were consolidated as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ the area of land given the name <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> and specified in section 17 and Part 1 of Schedule 9 to, the <i>Regional Forest Agreement (Land Classification) Act 1998</i> ceased to be reserved land, and;</li><li>▪ the proclamation notified in the Gazette as Statutory Rules 1990, No. 79, was revoked, and;</li><li>▪ the proclamation notified in the Gazette as Statutory Rules 2000, No. 241 was amended by omitting from Schedule 1 to that proclamation the item relating to an area of 2,730 hectares (indicated on CPR Plan 5006), and;</li><li>▪ 90 870 hectares of Crown land (indicated on CPR Plan 5722) was declared to be reserved land in the class of conservation area and was given the name '<b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b>'.</li></ul> This proclamation consolidated and redefined the boundaries to include 90,870ha of land.
31 December 2002	The <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> was replaced by the <i>National Parks and Reserves Management Act 2002</i> and the <i>Nature Conservation Act 2002</i> . <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b> continued to be reserved in the same reserve class but administered under the <i>Nature Conservation Act 2002</i> .

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## Walls of Jerusalem National Park

Date	Description
24 June 1981	An area of Crown land comprising 11,510 hectares (indicated on Land Management Plan 182) was proclaimed to be a conservation area and a State reserve, to be known as the ' <b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b> ', under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 127 of 1981). This proclamation incorporated areas of the <b>Central Plateau Wildlife Sanctuary</b> , as well as other areas not previously reserved into the new national park.
27 June 1990	<p>In a proclamation defining new boundaries for the <b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b> under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> (Statutory Rules 1990, No.84):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• all Crown land within the 51,800 hectares specified as 'Walls of Jerusalem National Park' and indicated definitively on CPR Plans 1886, 1887, 1888, 1889, 1894, 1895, 1896, 1897 and 1898, and also indicated in smaller scale on CPR Plan *1827, that was not already a conservation area, was declared to be a conservation area, and;</li><li>• that conservation area along with the remainder of the area specified as <b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b> on the CPR Plans listed above – being the pre-existing 23,250 hectare conservation area known as the <b>Central Plateau Conservation Area</b>, were declared to be a State reserve and were given the name '<b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b>', and;</li><li>• the name of so much of the <b>Cradle Mountain – Lake St Clair National Park</b> as falls within the CPR Plans specified above was altered to '<b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b>'.</li></ul> <p>This proclamation effectively extended the Walls of Jerusalem National Park from 11,510ha to 51,800ha.</p>
30 April 1999	<p>At the commencement of the relevant sections of the <i>Regional Forest Agreement (Land Classification) Act 1998</i>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the conservation area and State reserve known as '<b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b>' was revoked by virtue of section 12 of that Act, and by virtue of section 14 (1) of that Act the same area was then declared to be reserved land in the class of national park and was taken to have been so declared under the <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> and continued to be known by the same name - '<b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b>'.</li></ul>
31 December 2002	The <i>National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970</i> was replaced by the <i>National Parks and Reserves Management Act 2002</i> and the <i>Nature Conservation Act 2002</i> . <b>Walls of Jerusalem National Park</b> continued to be reserved in the same reserve class but administered under the <i>Nature Conservation Act 2002</i> .

- \*Proclamations defining new boundaries for the reserves within the World Heritage Area, which were gazetted on 27 June 1990, contain an error regarding the reference to Central Plan Register Plan 1827 which is not the relevant plan. CPR Plan 1872 is the intended plan.
