If registration is required urgently, i.e. within 10 business days of receipt of the application, then an additional temporary fast track fee is payable. As the Board usually only meets quarterly, temporary registration under s20 of the Act may be granted until the application can be considered by the Board.

DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED:

1. Completed application form and Statutory Declaration which has been witnessed by a Commissioner for Declarations or Justice of the Peace.
2. The application fee and pro-rata annual fee (and fast track fee if applicable) as per the fee schedule -see current list of fees on the website.

3. Proof of qualification:
 - a) *certified copy of your veterinary degree;
 - b) *certified copy of the NVE, NAVLE, PAVE, ECVFG certificate (if applicable);
 - c) (Provisional registration applicants: the issuing University/body will supply a list of students/graduands about to graduate to the Registrar).
4. A *certified copy of photographic evidence of identify, for example, drivers licence or passport.
5. Evidence of change of name if name on the application form differs from that on the proof of qualification (eg *certified copy of marriage certificate or change of name certificate issued by BDM).
6. A letter or certification of good standing (LOGS/LOPS) from the Registrar of the registering veterinary authority that you are or were last registered with (in Australia or overseas). The letter will be sent directly to the Board by the other registering veterinary authority.
7. If the applicant is not a new graduate, and is not currently registered with another Board, a statement setting out the applicant's work history and reason for non- registration.

***Note:** A certified copy is a document that has been certified as a true copy of an original document. To obtain a certified copy of a document, take the original document and a photocopy to either a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner for Declarations (CD) and ask them to certify that the photocopy is a true and correct copy of the original document. That person will need to write a statement to certify that it is a true copy of the original; the following is a suggested wording:

'I, [full name], [qualification], of [address] certify that this [name of document] is a true and correct copy of the [name of original document] [signature & date]'
