Comments / Explanations:

Trainers Brendan McShane (Edwin Batt), Kirstin Whelan and Stuart Gandy were reprimanded and Trainer John Blacker was fined \$50 for presenting horses to the mounting yard later than acceptable.

AR 124 requires horses to be in the mounting yard 15 minutes prior to the advertised start time. The Stewards understand the difficulties associated with licensed persons adhering to this requirement, especially at night meetings, however with mounting yard presentations and races being exported nationally and to emerging overseas wagering markets it is vitally important races are run on time. Trainers presenting horses to the mounting yard later than acceptable will be fined and horses may be directed to proceed immediately to the barriers in order for races to start on time.

RACE 1 – FASHIONS FOR FILLIES MAIDEN – 1200 METRES

Owens – Laid in in early part of home straight.

Dad's Girl – Slow to begin (1L). Laid in on home turn.

Global Princess – Rider Sigrid Carr reported laid out throughout. Post-race veterinary examination, no abnormalities detected. Trainer Royston Carr explained that he was disappointed in the performance and the mare had pulled up well. Mr Carr added that it is his intention to continue on with its preparation.

Red Harvest – Starter reported was difficult to load, warning issued. Shifted out soon after the start and bumped with **Kelsang**. Rider Craig Luttrell reported his saddle slipped on the home turn placing him at a disadvantage.

RACE 2 – CORPORATE GOLF DAY CLASS 1 HCP – 1200 METRES

Ain't The Whiskey – Late scratching at 5.25pm when the mare was found to be lame.

Liberty Dance – Late scratching at 6.29pm when the blindfold was unable to be fitted and the horse was therefore unable to be loaded into the barriers. After taking into account submissions by Trainer Angela Brakey and its poor barrier history, Liberty Dance has been stood down for two consecutive satisfactory trials.

Aerosport – Jumped away awkwardly and was slow into stride (1L). Over-raced in the early stages. Laid in rounding the home turn and in the home straight.

Canam – Rider Luke Currie reported the gelding was held up for clear racing room until passing 50 metre mark and was unable to be fully tested in the run to the line.

Mona – Approaching 800 metres steadied when tightened between **Commanding Dash** and **Shutterfly** who laid in. As a result, Canam had to check off the heels of Mona.

Phantasmagoria – Near 800 metres, checked off the heels of Mona.

Almost Art – Held up for clear racing room until approaching the 150 metre mark.

Commanding Dash – Inconvenienced after the start. Saddle slipped sideways approaching the winning post.

Crib Point – Slow to muster early speed.

RACE 3 – STUD & GALLOPING GOURMET TOUR IN FEBRUARY MAIDEN – 1400 METRES

Cincha – Late scratching at 2.55pm when Trainer Royston Carr reported the gelding was lame in the off fore. Veterinary certificate required before racing again.

George's Gambol – Hung in in the home straight before being held up and unable to be fully tested in the run to line.

Bad Luck – Raced wide throughout. Laid in passing the 150 metres carrying **Torre Velasca** inwards.

His Nibs – Raced wide throughout.

Kyogle Son – Stewards queried rider Boris Thornton in regards to his riding tactics in the early stages of the event. Mr Thornton explained he felt the horse attempt to buck and was of the opinion his saddle may have slipped, after checking his saddle was in the correct position he elected to continue racing and as the pace was slow Mr Thornton decided to go forward instead of being caught wide.

Vivre Star – Held up on the latter part of the home turn and the early part of the home straight. Rider David Pires pleaded guilty to a charge of careless riding, the carelessness being that passing the 150 metres, he shifted outwards when insufficiently clear of **In Bloom**, tightening **In Bloom** on to **Teddy's Fault** who was turned inwards checking In Bloom between Vivre Star and Teddy's Fault. As a result, **Pura Vida** who was trailing Teddy's Fault was also checked by its rider. Mr Pires' licence to ride in races was suspended for two race dates commencing midnight 25 January 2017 and expiring midnight 3 February 2017.

Broadway Velvet – Trainer Bill Ryan was fined the sum of \$50 for presenting the mare to race without earmuffs. Starter reported was fractious in the barriers, warning issued.

In Bloom - Held up on the latter part of the home turn and the early part of the home straight before being checked near the 150 metres.

Pura Vida - Checked near the 150 metres.

RACE 4 – AUSTRALIAN TRAINERS ASSOCIATION CLASS 3 HCP – 1400 METRES

Gallow Gate – Over-raced in the early stages.

Appmat – Starter reported was fractious in the barriers, warning issued.

Taramaya – An inquiry was opened into the riding tactics of Georgie Catania in this event, in particular in the home straight. Initial evidence was taken from trainer Scott Brunton and rider Georgie Catania with the inquiry is adjourned to a date to be set.

Sea Ruler – Laid in rounding the home turn and become unbalanced.

Cosmic Angel – Held up for clear racing room until the 100 metres.

Danwish – Rider Hayley McCarthy permitted to ride 1kg over the allotted weight. Rider lost whip approaching the 200 metres.

Kompressor – Trainer Charlie Goggin explained that the gelding is better suited racing outside other horses and in his opinion appreciated the firmer track.

RACE 5 – STEVE’S LIQUOR THOUSAND GUINEAS – 1600 METRES

Hot Dipped – Slow into stride (1L).

Toorak Affair – Rider Ismail Toker reported the filly was not suited to the slow tempo and was left flat footed when the pace increased. The filly was accidentally struck on the head entering the home straight by the whip of Daniel Ganderton.

Bailee’s Moshe – Shifted in passing the 200 metres and bumped with Miss Bluegrass who had shifted out marginally resulting in both fillies becoming unbalanced.

RACE 6 – LUXBET STAKES – 1200 METRES

The start of this event was delayed three minutes due to horses arriving late at the barriers and **Le Bel Opera** being fractious in the barriers.

Gee Gee Red Prince – Jumped inwards at the start and bumped with Admiral.

Red Eagle – Late scratching at 8.00pm due to a float breakdown.

Le Bel Opera – Starter reported was fractious in the barriers, stood down for one satisfactory trial. Post-race veterinary examination, no abnormalities detected. Co Trainer Trent Wells explained that after displaying fractious barrier manners at his last two starts and performing poorly it is his intention to send the gelding for a spell. Mr Wells added that the gelding had been training well and pulled up from the run without any issues.

Admiral – Laid in approaching the 100 metres.

RACE 7 – LAUNCESTON CUP EVE MINGLE & CALCUTTA BM62 HCP – 1200 METRES

Classic Outlaw – Laid in under pressure near the 150 metres, tightening Downwind. Rider Chris Graham pleaded guilty to a charge of careless riding, the carelessness being that passing the 1000 metres he allowed his horse to shift in and tighten the running of **Streak On** for a considerable distance before that mare lost its racing position. Mr Graham’s licence to ride in races was suspended for a period of two race dates commencing midnight 1 February 2017 and expiring midnight 5 February 2017.

Another Charlie – Starter reported was fractious in the barriers, warning issued

Marbel Duke – Over-raced when being restrained for a short distance approaching the 800 metres.

Downwind – Tactics queried, Trainer Charlie Goggin explained that the mare failed to finish off at its most recent start when racing forward and is better suited to getting back in the field. Mr Goggin added that he anticipated a quicker early tempo. Post-race veterinary examination, no abnormalities detected.

RACE 8 – LAUNCESTON TRAVEL & CRUISE CENTRE BM72 HCP – 2100 METRES

Demons Run – Slow to begin (1L). Rider Nathan Punch was fined \$100 for use of whip 8 times prior to the 100 metres.

Big Pegg – Bumped with Gold Librettist near the 100 metres.

Sport Of Kings – Slow to begin (2L).

Miss Hissy – Rider Sherry Barr questioned regarding her tactics adopted on the mare. S Barr reported the mare appreciated the step up to 2100 metre distance and travelled well throughout the event and, in her opinion, is a mare that fights the rider if restrained.

Ocean Star – Over-raced and threw its head in the air when being restrained for a considerable distance approaching the winning post on the first occasion.

RACE 9 – AUSTRALIA DAY EVE GREAT AUSSIE BBQ 3YO MAIDEN – 1200 METRES

The Name's Bond – Commenced to tire from passing the 600 metres. Post-race veterinary examination found the gelding to be blowing excessively post-race.

Korn Broke – Trainer Barry Campbell reported the mare had pulled up well however it is his intention to send the mare for a spell.

Electric Crimson – Trainer Scott Brunton reported the gelding was not suited by the pace of the race and will derive benefit from the run after being freshened up to run in the Devonport Cup.

King Manu – Stable representative Scott Brunton reported the gelding had pulled up well from the run.
