Comments / Explanations:

RACE 1 – ROD THIRKELL-JOHNSTON MAIDEN– 1400 METRES

Gratius – Late scratching at 11am due to no available rider.

Needs A Scotch (A Darmanin) - Rider A Darmanin stated that the gelding travelled comfortable in the run, however failed to respond to his riding when placed under pressure. A Darmanin added that he felt something may have been amiss with its action. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to have a slow recovery and elevated heart rate. A Darmanin pleaded guilty to a charge under AR137A(5)(a)(ii) in that he used his whip on nine occasions prior to the 100 metres which is 4 more than permitted. A Darmanin was subsequently fined the sum of \$200. In determining penalty Stewards took into consideration Mr Darmanin's good record and the totality of his whip use.

Rogue One (S Amano) - Near the 1000 metres was restrained when momentarily tightened for room by Red Fiore (C Graham). C Graham was advised to exercise care when shifting ground. Rider S Amano stated that when placed under pressure in the home straight he felt something amiss behind with the gelding. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. Stewards will follow up with trainer M Cowen in the coming days to see if any matter has arisen with the gelding.

Gee Gees Magic Man (S Carr) – Inconvenienced at the start by Fontein Ali, which had been carried outwards by Red Fiore. Hung in from the 800 metres. In the home straight hung in and proved difficult to ride. Rider S Carr reported that the gelding hung in for the majority of the race and she was unable to ride the gelding out in her normal manner in the home straight. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. A warning has been placed on the gelding's race manner.

Red Fiore (C Graham) – Commenced awkwardly and shifted out onto Fontein Ali.

Fontein Ali (T Voorham) – At the start, carried out onto GeeGees Magic Man. Raced three wide without cover throughout.

Posh Pursuit (A Patis) – Rider A Patis stated that the mare lay out over the concluding stages.

Rodessa (D Ganderton) – Momentarily held up rounding the home turn.

Master Onslow - Late scratching at 8:48am due to no available rider.

Rhode Away - Late scratching at 11am due to no available rider.

RACE 2 – R.M. BERTRAM BENCH MARK 58 HCP – 1400 METRES

Cranny Flyer (A Patis) – In the early part of the home straight, steadied off the heels of Dubbo.

George's Gambol (T Voorham) – Raced three wide without cover throughout.

Little Pumba (A Darmanin) – Lay out over the concluding stages.

Gee Gee Rich Ruby (S Carr) – Prior to racing, Trainer S Gandy advised that the mare was in season. Performed below expectations. Rider S Carr stated that the mare, which had been racing over 1200 metres at its most recent starts may not have been suited to the step up to 1400 metres. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Mulley's Idol (D Ganderton) – When questioned regarding the apparent improved performance trainer Mr J Blacker explained that the gelding had shown good ability as a three year old, however lost form towards the end of its last preparation. J Blacker added that the gelding was down in class today and was more suited by the 1400 metre distance. J Blacker further added that the gelding which drew a good barrier also had a nice run in transit.

Savrajette (S Amano) – Threw its head on jumping away. Raced four wide without cover in the early stages when over racing.

Dubbo (B Smith) – Performed below expectations. Rider B Smith explained that the mare did not appreciate racing tightly between runners, however had failed to respond to her ridding when placed under pressure. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Miss Merikan – Rider R Bishop stated that the mare failed to respond to his riding. Trainer C Thompson advised that the mare will now be retired.

RACE 3 – T.G. JOHNSTON BENCH MARK 58 HCP– 1600 METRES

Chloe's King (A Patis) – Shortly after the start, severely checked and blundered almost dislodging its rider when tightened for room between Littlerayov, which shifted out despite the efforts of its rider and Super Leane. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Littlerayov (D Ganderton) – Shortly after the start, shifted out, making contact and tightening Chloe's King, out on to Super Leane.

Olly's a Star (T Voorham) – Shortly after the start was bumped by Super Leane and taken out onto Ramaadi Bullet.

Ramaadi Bullet (B Muhcu) – Shortly after the start, bumped by Olly's A Star.

Super Leane (S Amano) – Shortly after the start, became unbalanced after bumping and tightening the running of Chloe's King. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Akbar Jay (R Bishop) – Slow into stride.

Global Princess (T Baker) – After leading by a considerable distance, compounded from the 500 metres. When questioned, rider T Baker explained that it had been his intention to ride the mare handy with cover, however with no early pace to his inside and after crossing the lead, the mare then commenced to over race and pull extremely hard and he was unable to restrain which resulted in the mare compounding quickly. T Baker added that the mare, which has had three weeks between runs may have been too fresh when stepping up to 1600 metres. Stewards questioned trainer R Carr who confirmed the instructions given to rider T Baker. Mr Carr was also of the view that the mare may have been too fresh after having three weeks off. R Carr advised that he would inform Stewards if any matter arises with the mare in the coming days. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the mare to have a slow recovery and an elevated heart rate.

RACE 4 – S.B FREELAND BENCH MARK 76 HCP– 1600 METRES

Bidirectional (A Darmanin) – Slow into stride.

Earl da Vinci (NZ) (T Baker) – A post-race veterinary examination revealed the presence of blood in both nostrils. Connections were advised of the provisions of AR53A(4) in that Earl da Vinci (NZ) may not be trained, exercised or galloped on any race course for a period of two months and it may not start in any race for a period of three months and then only after a satisfactory gallop of at least 1000 metres in the presence of a Steward.

RACE 5 – TASMANIAN TURF CLUB MEMBERS CLASS 4 HCP – 1200 METRES

Savs Finale (T Baker) – Momentarily held up rounding the home turn.

Silzoar (C Graham) – Rider C Graham reported that the gelding was inclined to lay out in the home straight.

Nunivak (S Carr) – After leading, weakened over the concluding stages. Performed below expectations. Rider S Carr explained that the gelding lay out rounding the home turn and felt awkward in its action in the home straight. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. Trainer S Brunton advised that the gelding will now be retired.

Aspirate (D Ganderton) – Reared after being loaded in its barrier. A warning will continue on the gelding. Fractious in the barrier prior to the start. Commenced awkwardly and lost ground.

RACE 6 – E.L EGAN CLASS 1 HCP – 1200 METRES

Fontein Harry (C Graham) – Approaching the 800 metres momentarily tightened for room between Knitting, which shifted in slightly and Orphanali.

Beenagem (T Baker) – Slow into stride.

Emsgem (A Patis) – Raced three wide without cover throughout. Rider A Patis reported that she felt something may have been amiss with the mares action. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. Trainer Mr V Poke advised that the plate of the tongue control bit had shifted and became wedged in the corner of the mare's mouth.

Kenfromthebar (B Smith) – Rider B Smith stated that after beginning well the gelding settled further forward than intended.

Orphanali (D Ganderton) – Approaching the 100 metres was disappointed for a run behind Knitting, which had shifted in, before then shifting wider on the track to obtain clear running.

Knitting (B Muhcu) – Rider B Muhcu stated that due to the early pace he settled slightly further back than intended.

Lady Wynette (M Ulucinar) – Over raced and raced ungenerously in the early stages. Passing the 1000 meters when over racing, restrained off the heels of Fontein Harry (C Graham), which shifted in when not quite clear. C Graham was severely reprimanded under AR137(a), careless riding, and was advised to exercise far greater care when shifting ground. Rider M Ulucinar stated the mare raced ungenerously in the early stages when being restrained to obtain cover.

RACE 7 – W.O. LAYH BM70 HCP – 1400 METRES

Axion (A Darmanin) – Bumped at the start with Monmouth.

Aventador (C Graham) – Bumped heavily at the start with Rougeau.

Rougeau (T Voorham) – Bumped heavily at the start with Aventador.

Monmouth (B Muhcu) – Bumped at the start with Axion.

Westwood (S Carr) – Slow into stride.

RACE 8 – SCHWEPPESS CLASS 2 HCPCI2– 1600 METRES

Invincible Rock – Trainer S Carr advised that the gelding had pulled up well however has been sent to the paddock for around 10 days for a freshen up. S Carr added that the gelding may not have handled the shifty track surface.

RACE 2 – NORWOOD NEWS & POST OFFICE MAIDEN – 1220 METRES

Cunning Fox – Trainer J Blacker advised that the gelding had pulled up well and showed no signs of being galloped on.

Ronny Zacapa –Trainer S Carr advised that the gelding had received minor lacerations to the hind leg however had pulled up well. S Carr added that connections are now considering the geldings racing future.

RACE 5 – SHEFFIELD NEWSAGENCY BENCHMARK 64 HCP – 1620 METRES

Quick Quill – Trainer S Carr advised that the mare had pulled up very well and would continue on with its preparation.

RACE 7 – PROSPECT MARKETPLACE NEWSAGENCY BENCHMARK 64 HCP– 1220 METRES

Gee Gee Queen Bee – Trainer S Gandy advised that subsequent to the run the filly was found to be in season. S Gandy added that the filly underwent an endoscopic examination and no abnormalities were detected.
