Comments / Explanations:

All Jockeys underwent breath analysis prior to riding today.

RACE 1 – TOUR DE CURE MAIDEN– 1400 METRES

Race the Wind (D Ganderton) – Approaching the 100 metres, carried inward by San You.

Real Acclaim (T Voorham) – Had difficulty obtaining clear running between the 400 metres and 200 metres.

San You (S Kok) – Had some difficulty obtaining clear running over the final 100 metres.

Banca Syd (J Maskiell) – Raced three wide without cover in the early stages before being allowed to stride forward and take up the lead near the 900 metres. J Maskiell stated that the gelding had to work hard early when caught wide which was detrimental to the way it finished off the race.

Tough It Out (A Patis) – Tailed the field for the majority of the race. A Patis could offer no excuse for the performance other than the mare may be better suited to a further distance. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. A warning has been placed on the mare. Trainer G White advised that the mare would now be retired.

Buzzered (A Darmanin) – Unable to obtain clear running between the 500 metres and 150 metres.

Little Pegg (T Baker) – Performed below market expectations. T Baker explained that in his view the filly, may not have been suited to racing without blinkers for the first time and failed to run out the 1400 metres which was also its first start over the distance. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Mountain Music (R Clark) – Held up for clear running between the 400 metres and 100 metres

Maleluji (I Toker) – Approaching the 800 metres when racing keenly, steadied when improved up onto the heels of Mountain Music.

RACE 2 – AUSTRALIAN TRAINERS ASSOCIATION MAIDEN/CLASS 1– 1600 METRES

Dobell (T Baker) – Raced three wide without cover throughout. Near the 400 metres restrained off the heels of The Last Godfather, (B Muhcu) when tightened for room between that runner and Fontein Harry, which had been carried out slightly by Portrait Painting, (E Kacmaz). B Muhcu and E Kacmaz were advised to exercise care when shifting ground. Passing the 200 metres, steadied when tightened between Blackberry Rose and Fontein Harry, (B McCoull) which was inclined to lay out. B McCoull was advised to exercise care when shifting ground. Performed below expectations. Rider T Baker stated that after being caught wide throughout, the gelding then failed to run on in the home straight. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

Fontein Harry (B McCoull) – Passing the 400 metres, momentarily tightened between Portrait Painting and Dobell. Inclined to lay out in the home straight. Performed below expectations. Rider B McCoull explained that the gelding raced ungenerously when under pressure and in his opinion may be better suited to a track with more give. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. Subsequent to the race meeting trainer J Blacker added that the gelding did sweat up prior to the race and in his view may not have backed up from its previous run on 12 February. J Blacker added that he had expected a forward showing and was disappointed with the performance, and would look to space the geldings runs in future.

Sudden Shock (J Maskiell) – Approaching the 400 metres, momentarily tightened for room by Portrait Painting which shifted in slightly.

Blackberry Rose (J Winks) – Slow into stride.

Starbration (A Darmanin) – Momentarily held up rounding the home turn. Passing the 200 metres, restrained when tightened between Boss Cat (S Kok), which shifted out and Fontein Harry. Rider S Kok was advised to exercise care when shifting ground.

RACE 3 – TASBREEDERS BENCHMARK 72 HCP– 1600 METRES

Agree To (T Voorham) – (second place) Prior to correct weight, T Voorham wished to view the official photo. After viewing the photo T Voorham was satisfied and correct weight was declared. Near the 1400 metres, steadied off the heels of Century Arrow (A Darmanin), which shifted in when not fully clear. A Darmanin was advised to exercise care when shifting ground. Over the concluding stages brushed with Manilenya

Gallow Gate (S Kok) – Commenced awkwardly, bumping with Voices.

The Master Speed (E Kacmaz) – Over raced in the early and middle stages. E Kacmaz stated that the gelding pulled hard through the middle stages, which was detrimental to the way that it finished off the run.

Manilenya (B Muhcu) - Over the concluding stages brushed with Agree To.

Voices (A Patis) – Bumped with Gallow Gate at the start.

Submit Another (T Baker) – Shortly after the start, checked off the heels of Century Arrow.

RACE 4 – WINNING EDGE BENCHMARK 64 HCP– 2100 METRES

Sentry Duty (A Patis) – An inquiry has been adjourned into the tactics adopted on the gelding.

Barjeel (D Ganderton) – Rider D Ganderton stated that the gelding failed to respond when placed under pressure and felt something may have been amiss. A post-race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities.

One Way Ticket (NZ) (A Darmanin) – Change of tactics. Trainer advised due to a tendency to over-race will attempt to lead. Raced outside the leader. Rider A Darmanin accidentally dropped his whip near the 100 metres. An inquiry has been adjourned into the tactics adopted on the gelding.

Really Sure (B Allen) – Performed below expectations. Rider B Allen explained that the mare was under pressure from the 800 metres and in his view may appreciate a track with more give. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the mare to be lame in the near hind, and a veterinary clearance is required prior to the mare racing again.

RACE 5 – MAGIC MILLIONS 2YO CLASSIC– 1200 METRES

Heaven's Bonus (B Muhcu) – Over raced in the early and middle stages and raced greenly throughout.

Easy Road (NZ) (A Darmanin) – Bumped at the start with Sidorova. Raced wide throughout.

Man Of The Moment (D Ganderton) – Slow into stride. Rounding the home turn, severely checked by the fallen Misslittleturf, and fell. D Ganderton was examined by the on course medical officers who reported some superficial abrasions to D Ganderton's left shoulder which required no further treatment. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a laceration to the near fore cannon, with no other abnormalities detected. Subsequent to the race meeting co-trainer T Wells advised that the gelding had recovered well and was showing no signs of any issues. T Wells added that the gelding would now be spelled.

Sidorova (R Clark) – Shifted out at the start, bumping with Easy Road (NZ). Raced greenly throughout. Raced three wide without cover.

Misslittleturf (R Bishop) – An inquiry has been adjourned into the reasons for the filly falling, rounding the home turn. Rider R Bishop was examined by the on course medical officers and transported to hospital for further treatment. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a minor laceration to the off fore pastern, with no other abnormalities detected. Subsequent to the race meeting trainer B McShane advised that the filly had recovered well and was showing no signs of any issues.

RACE 6 – MAGIC MILLIONS 3YO/4YO CLASSIC– 1400 METRES

The start of this race was delayed slightly due to the fall from the previous race.

Balearic (B McCoull) – Bumped with Hezalite at the start. Near the 400 metres was steadied when tightened for room between Mandela Effect, which shifted in slightly and Hezalite, which had been taken outward by Silent Bid, (J Bowditch) which had shifted out. J Bowditch was advised to exercise care when shifting ground. Rider B McCoull explained that the gelding travelled well, however after receiving some minor interference on the home turn, the gelding then failed to respond to his riding.

Silent Bid (J Bowditch) – Passing the 300 metres was carried wider by Bosporus.

Jubilance (B Allen) – Tactics queried. Rider B Allen explained it had not been his intention to lead and that his instructions were to ride the mare mid-field, however with the lack of early speed he was left further forward than intended. B Allen added that the mare may also be suited by a track with more give.

Hezalite (R Clark) – Bumped with Balearic at the start. Raced three wide without cover throughout. Near the 400 metres, tightened for room between Balearic and Silent Bid which shifted out.

RACE 7 – BROOKLYN PARK TASMANIAN OAKS– 2100 METRES

The start of this race was delayed due to True Magic being re-plated in the mounting yard.

Our Long Sali (A Darmanin) – Over raced in the early and middle stages. Raced three wide without cover from the 1100 metres until racing outside the lead nearing the 800 metres. Rider A Darmanin stated that the filly pulled hard through the early and middle stages and when the pace eased near the 1200 metres he permitted his mount to stride forward.

Glass Warrior (J Maskiell) – Rider J Maskiell stated that the filly was under pressure from the 800 metres, however did finish off the race satisfactorily. J Maskiell added that the filly may have come to the end of its preparation.

Shady Hustle (B Muhcu) – Change of tactics. Trainer advised will attempt to be ridden mid-field with cover. After racing three wide without cover in the early stages, allowed to stride forward from the 1600 metres. Rider B Muhcu stated that he had been instructed to ride the filly mid field with cover, however after being unable to obtain cover he then elected to roll forward.

True Magic (B Allen) – Required to be re-plated in the mounting yard, delaying the start of the race.

Fast And Ready (J Winks) – Performed below expectations. Rider J Winks stated that he felt something was amiss with the filly. As the gelding had left the course prior to the veterinary surgeon being able to conduct an examination Stewards will follow up with the Corstens stable in the coming days to see if any matter has arisen.

Secret Gold (T Baker) – Rider T Baker stated that the filly may not have been suited by leading as it raced often on the bit throughout the race.

Grabbing Glory (R Clark) – Late scratching at 2.52 PM after the filly underwent a veterinary examination after arriving on course and was found to be lame in the off hind. A veterinary clearance is required prior to racing again.

Khanion Bay (J Bowditch) – Over raced in the early and middle stages.

RACE 8 – KEVIN SHARKIE CLASS 3 HCP– 1200 METRES

The start of this race was delayed due to Kepta having to have its tongue tie re fitted.

Date Night (J Maskiell) – Raced three wide without cover in the early and middle stages.

Lord Smedley (J Winks) – Rider J Winks accidentally dropped his whip near the 100 metres.

The Greatness (T Baker) – Unable to improve its position over the concluding stages.

Kwai (R Clark) – Lay in under pressure in the home straight. Rider R Clark stated that the filly may have come to the end of its preparation. A post-race veterinary examination revealed nasal discharge and a veterinary clearance is required prior to racing again.

Miss Smith (T Voorham) – Re-saddled after arriving at the barriers. Passing the 100 metres, tightened for room by Gee Gee Rich Ruby, which had been taken in slightly by Kwai (R Clark). R Clark was advised to exercise care when permitting her mounts to shift ground.

Gee Gee Rich Ruby (S Kok) – Passing the 100 metres, carried inward slightly by Kwai.

Ansaam (E Kacmaz) – Underwent a veterinary examination after arriving on course and passed suitable to race as the mare had not raced since 26 December 2017.

Kepta (A Patis) – R Bishop granted permission to ride 1kg over the allotted weight of 54kg. As Ryan Bishop was indisposed, Stewards then approved apprentice A Patis to replace Ryan Bishop as there were no other available senior riders. Required to have its tongue tie re fitted at the barriers which delayed the start.

My Biddy – Trainer M Cowen advised that the mare had pulled up well, Mr Cowen added that the mare failed to handle the soft conditions and will be better suited to a firmer track.
